Papastrateio Archaeological Museum



Built in the 1960's, the archaeological museum was funded by Papastratos Bros who were well-known as the owners of the local tobacco industry.



It hosts objects of great archaeological importance found in Aetoloakarnania. Although small, the museum is one of the most interesting in the region. It includes findings from the Prehistoric and Roman times found

all over the prefecture of
Aetoloakarnania: Pots from the
Classical, Geometrical and Neolithic
era, findings from Mycenaean tombs,
impressive columns, statues,
figurines, busts of heroes and gods.
It is divided in six halls three of
which house the exhibits.



The Folklore Museum of Agrinion

It was founded in 1977. It all started with a traditional bread exhibition and an exhibition of woven rugs that followed, which finally resulted in the creation of the Folk Museum. The museum is divided in thematic areas: The Tobacco Museum, The Museum of Water and The Literary Museum. Its exhibits include objects of cult and

agricultural use with an emphasis on the paraphernalia of the growing of tobacco and the everyday life of people in the past.
